Nidula emodensis

Cup: crucible or urn-shaped, 4-6 mm high x 4-6 mm wide

External buff-grey becoming darker, covered with closely appressed tomentum (felty)

Internal whitish- grey, smooth, shiny

Peridioles: more than 10, reddish-brown to black, 0.5-1 mm diam., rugulose

Spores: narrowly ellipsoid, or obovate or pyriform, 6-9 x 4-6 mu (Cunningham 1924)

(but Brodie's samples: 4-5 x 3-4 mu)
