
Nidularia deformis

Cup: subglobose, to cushion shaped, up to 10mm diam., cream to cinnamon-buff, thin, felty texture, lacking typical epiphragm, breaks open irregularly.

Peridioles: numerous, chestnut brown, lens shaped, 0.5-2 mm, in gelatinous matrix.

Spores: white, broadly ellipsoid, smooth, 6-10 x 4-7mu.

Microscopy: Angular rigid, spiny hyphae in peridial wall, without septa.

Substrate: wet and rotting wood, wood chip mulch, in large fused groups.

Notes: This is an uncommon fungus and there are no collections in BRI.
