## Amanita punctata

**Cap:** cap hemispherical to convex; up to 80 mm diameter; glabrous and slightly viscid; dark grey (13E1, 14E1), margin faintly pellucid striate; velar remains on cap in large white/ pale grey patch

**Stipe:** cylindrical with a very slightly expanded base;  $60 - 170 \times 8 - 10$  mm; glabrous, but with some clusters of hairs; grey, paler than cap; no ring; saccate grey volva

**Gills:** free; crowded; greying cream with a distinct dark grey edge; lamelulae present in one series

Flesh: very pale grey Spore print: white.

**Spores:** globose;  $10 - 12 \times 9.7 - 11.6 \, \mu \text{m}$ , Q = 1.02; inamyloid.

Cheilocvstidia: Not seen

**Pileipellis:** ovoid pedunculate cells,  $25 - 35 \times 20 - 25 \mu m$ 

Habitat: growing singly in open ground under Eucalyptus species

**Notes:** this dark grey *Amanita* with pale velar remains in large patches, a dark lamellar edge and a grey saccate volva should be easy to recognise in the field. Six records in Queensland **Collections examined:** PL 9609, Wallace Park, Noosaville, Pat Leonard, 9 Jun 09.
