**Cap:** convex; 8 – 10 mm diameter; intensely squamulose; dark brown to black squamules on a paler background.

**Stipe:** cylindrical; 30 × 1 – 2 mm; glabrous; greeny yellow, browning with age.

**Gills:** deeply emarginate, pink with an almost black edge.

**Flesh:** thin, whitish.

**Smell:** none

**Chemical reactions:**

**Spores:** pink; pentagonal; 8 – 10 × 6 – 7 µm.

**Basidia:**

**Cheilocystidia:** clavate, with coloured contents, forming a dark edge to the gill.

**Pleurocystidia:** not seen.

**Pileipellis:** an ixocutis.

**Habitat:** growing singly in litter in rainforest.

**Notes:** this small *Entoloma* appears to be undescribed. It keys to *E. linkii* in Noordeloos, but is clearly not that species. The dark squamulose cap and contrasting pink gills with a dark edge are good field characters.
