

Gymnopus sp PL70315

Cap: convex; 25 – 30 mm diameter; covered in adpressed fibrils; greyish orange (6B3); margin entire.

Stipe: cylindrical; some caespitose; 40 × 3 – 5 mm; vertically fibrillose; tough, white but surface blackening on bruising on lower 2/3rd.

Gills: adnexed; more or less lax; white; lamellulae present.

Flesh: white, thin, tough.

Smell: pleasant.

Dermatocystidia: absent.

Pileipellis: a cutis of narrow hyphae.

Habitat: in litter in wet sclerophyl forest with a mixture of Eucalypts and rain forest trees.

Notes: This small *Gymnopus* does not appear to be any of the described species; the pale greyish buff colour and the blackening stipe might allow it to be identified in the field.
