Gleba: hemispherical with a flat base; $20 \times 20 \times 15$ mm; purplish grey in upper 2/3rds, cream in lower 1/3; covered in shallow dark purple grey scales which split to reveal cream flesh below.

Stipe: absent or very rudimentary, broadly attached to substrate.

Flesh: thin, cream.

Spores: ochraceous to yellowish brown; globose; 3-4 μ m, unornamented; no pedicel seen.

Habitat: growing in large troops on *Araucaria bidwilli* and other logs, sometimes entirely covering the substrate.

Notes: This small *Lycoperdon* like gasteromycete grows on logs and woody debris in large troops, its purplish grey colour and size should make it easy to recognise in the field; it appears to be restricted to rainforest habitats.
