Pisolithus microcarpus

Fruiting body: ovoid, gasteroid; 40×35 mm; golden brown with black warts. **Stipe:** rooting stem cylindrical; 40×15 mm; solid above ground but with rhizoids below; golden brown.

Flesh: granular ovoid cells surrounded by golden tissue contained in a thick walled and dark staining gleba

Spores: globose to subglobose; $6 - 7.5 \times 6 - 7.5 \mu m$; thick walled; with spines.

Basidia: not seen

Pileipellis: not examined.

Habitat: growing in pure sand in Wallum woodland close to *Callitris*. Stipe partly buried in ground.

Notes: Recognised by having a distinct stipe above the ground, which is generally taller than, the diameter of the fruiting body. It also has punctate to spiny spores. **Collections examined:** PL 24310, Noosa National Park, Marcus Beach section, Patrick Leonard, 8 Mar 10.
