

Tylopilus queenslandianus

Cap: broadly parabolic to convex; to 40 mms diameter; dark blonde with a pink flush (7B5); glabrous, slightly viscid when wet then tomentose.

Stipe: cylindrical; 70 × 5 mms; white at apex, dark blonde below then browning; scabrous appearing almost subreticulate.

Pores: adnexed to almost free; cream to very pale pink; pentagonal, edges stained pinkish brown by spores.

Flesh: white, then pink in cap and orange to brown in stipe.

Spore print: rusty brown.

Spores: elongated ellipsoid; 15 × 5 µm; no ornamentation or germ pore.

Cheilocystidia: clavate; 30 µm.

Pileipellis: trichoderm.

Habitat: singly in litter under *Eucalyptus* in wet sclerophyl forest.

Notes: Wolfe and Bougher's description of Halling's collection from Davies Creek is close, but the spores seem to be a little smaller.
