Cap: convex, flattened at the apex; 45-50 mm diameter; with a red brown disc at the apex and numerous red brown squamules elsewhere; margin slightly appendiculate. Stipe: cylindrical or tapering upwards, hollow; $70-80\times10-12$ mm; glabrous; white above ring, browning slightly below; ring with dark upper edge and striate.

Gills: free; moderately crowded, white; lamellulae present in a single series.

Flesh: thin, white, unchanging.

Taste:

Spore print: white.

Spores: ellipsoid; $6.1 - 8.7 \times 3.3 - 5.3 \ \mu m$, average $6.9 \pm 0.6 \times 4 \pm 0.5 \ \mu m$, Q = 1.23

-2.06, average Q = 1.72 \pm 0.2; smooth; no germ pore, dextrinoid.

Basidia: clavate; 2 and 4 spored.

Cheilocystidia: numerous; clavate; $20 - 27 \times 6.5 - 8 \mu m$.

Pileipellis: a cutis of brown pigmented cylindrical hyphae. Clamp connections absent.

Substrate: leaf litter and natural mulch. **Habitat:** rainforest with Eucalypts.

Notes: This collection fits Grgurinovic's description for *L. booloola*, except that the cheilocystidia are distinctly clavate rather than fusoid and the collection was made in

rainforest whereas Cleland's collection was apparently with *Pinus radiate*. **Collections examined:** Clark's Farm, Bellthorpe, Ix Nguyen, 16 Mar 2014.
