## Macrolepiota clelandii

**Cap:** broadly convex, with slight central depression and central umbo; 70mm diameter; creamy white colour with snuff brown central patch and surrounding scales,(1-2mm) scattered over the inner half of the cap. Outer half covered in fine snuff brown fibrils; slightly appendiculate margin.

**Stipe:** cylindrical and very tall;  $110 \times 6$  mm, broadening to 20mm at base; cream to buff brown, darker at base, which is covered with white mycelia. Small, persistent, annulus on upper third of stem; off white, with fine brown line at edge.

Gills: free; crowded; creamy white; 2-3 series of lamellulae.

**Flesh**: white.

**Spore print**: white.

**Spores:** ovoid;  $14-18\times 9-12$  µm, average  $16\times 10.5$  µm, Q=1.55; strongly dextrinoid, thick walled with prominent apiculus and probable germ pore. **Basidia:** clavate;  $38-50\times 10-14$ ; mostly two spored, some four spored.

Pleurocvstidia: absent.

**Pileipellis:** a cutis of repent hyphae, some of which are brown.

Substrate: soil and litter.

Habitat: solitary, in needles under planted Allocasuarina, Eucalyptus and rainforest

trees.

Collections examined: F2103069, F. Guard, Dilkusha NR, Maleny.

**Notes:** This specimen had received 11mm heavy rain a few hours before collection and probably lost some scales during that time. Description fits Grgurinovic p. 443 of "Larger Fungi of South Australia"
