## Microporus xanthopus

**Fruit body:** flat to broadly funnel shaped; 20 – 60 mm diameter; tough and leathery. **Upper surface:** dry, shiny; strongly banded in shades of buff and rich brown with the outer edge of the cap cream to white.

Lower surface: cream to white.

**Pores:** decurrent; white; pores minute, 7–10 per mm.

**Stipe:** central to slightly eccentric, broadly cylindrical but usually widening towards the base;  $10-45 \times 2-8$ mm; tough; attached to the substrate by a disc; cream or pale buff, but may be banded like the upper surface and the basal disc is yellow.

**Flesh:** very thin, 1–3 mm.

**Spore print:** white

**Spores:** ellipsoid;  $3.5-4 \times 2-2.5 \mu m$ ; smooth. **Substrate:** wood, including branches and logs. **Habitat:** forests, woodlands and parklands.

Frequency: common.

**Notes:** this species is recognised by its distinctive stem with a yellowish disc at the

base.
