Fruit body: ovoid to pyriform (like an upturned pear); 15 - 35 mm diameter; covered in small brown squamules that wash off leaving a reticulate pattern; yellowish brown, reddish brown or even pinkish brown.

Stipe: small to rudimentary whitish pseudostipe.

Gleba: deep purplish brown, marbled.

Flesh: thin, whitish.

Spore print: dark brown.

Spores: globose; $11 - 14 \times 11 - 14 \mu m$; echinulate with spines up to 2,5 μm high.

Basidia: not seen.

Habitat: in soil under *Eucalyptus* and other trees.

Notes: distinguished from the very similar S. verrucosum by its brown fruit body and

larger spores.
