## Scleroderma bovista

**Fruit body:** irregularly ovoid, tuberous (like a potato); 20 - 50 mm diameter; smooth or with minute squamules; pale yellowish to greyish brown.

Stipe: rudimentary.

Gleba: purplish black, marbled.

**Flesh**: thin, 1 - 1.5 mm.

**Spore print:** very dark brown.

**Spores:** globose to subglobose;  $11 - 14.5 \times 11 - 14.5 \mu m$ . with prominent reticulate

ornamentation  $1 - 2 \mu m$  high.

Basidia: not seen.

**Habitat:** in free draining soils under trees.

**Notes:** the least common of the sclerodermas in Queensland. It is recognised by the combination of its reticulate spores, lack of a stem, thin peridium and tuber like shape.
