Favolaschia calocera

Cap: applanate to slightly convex, often kidney shaped in outline, 10 - 30 mm diameter, an unmistakable bright orange colour.

Stipe: cylindrical, eccentric or attached laterally, $50 \times 1-2$ mm, often curved, bright orange like the cap.

Pores: deep, mostly pentagonal, if held up to the light one is able see the pattern of the pores as the flesh is translucent.

Flesh: thin, orange. Spore print: white.

Spores: ellipsoid to lacrymoid (tear shaped); $10 - 12.5 \times 8 - 9 \mu m$; smooth, amyloid.

Cystidia: Pileipellis:

Habitat: Growing in large troops on dead branches and twigs of no more than 50 cms diameter in rainforest. The host species could not be identified.

Notes: This is an introduced species and has become a weed.
