## Hydnum corneri nom prov.

**Habitat:** found in rings with Eucalyptus at a single site

Cap: applanate; 30 - 50 mms diameter; lannose; white to cream; margin

appendiculate ans slightly sulcate.

**Stipe:** central, cylindrical;  $18 - 20 \times 5 - 6$  mms diameter; colour similar to cap.

**Spines:** subdecurrent, crowded, tapering, to 4 mm long, held vertically; creamy ochre.

**Flesh:** white with a pleasant smell.

**Spores:** hyaline, globose;  $4.5 - 5 \times 4 - 4.5 \mu m$ , Q = 1.2; smooth.

Cheilocystidia: clavate, narrowly clavate;  $20 \times 5 \mu m$ . Pileipellis: not seen, but clamp connections present.

**Notes:** a white to cream to Hydnum with vertical spines and small spores appears

distinct from Hydnum repandum.
