Cap: conico convex; 30 mm diameter; somooth, somewhat greasy; white with greyish

tone; margin inrolled.

Stipe: cylindrical; $30 - 45 \times 4 - 6$ mm; glabrous but with a slight pruina; white.

Gills: adnate; moderately thick; lamellulae in 2 series; white.

Flesh: white; tough.

Smell: distinctive, rubbery, wine stoppers.

Spore print: white.

Spores: ellipsoid; $6.7 - 9 \times 4.2 - 5.3 \mu m$, average $7.8 \pm 0.6 \times 4.6 \pm 0.3$, Q = 1.45 - 2,

average $Q = 1.7 \pm 0.03$; smooth; amyloid.

Basidia: clavate; long, 4 spored.

Cheilocystidia: absent. Pleurocystidia: absent.

Pileipellis: an ixotrich0derm of thin walled hyaline hyphae.

Habitat: wet sclerophyll forest with *Eucalyptus*.

Notes: Hygrophorus are recognized by their neat shape, slightly rubbery texture,

sticky to greasy caps and white spores.
