Hypholoma lateritium

Cap: convex to somewhat umbonate, 20 - 65 mm diameter. Smooth, bright orange with a brownish tinge on the centre. Cap margin in-rolled.

Stipe: Smooth, pale sulphur yellow with a brownish tinge on the centre. Cap margin in-rolled.

Gills: sulphur yellow, developing a greenish tinge, then brown as the spores mature.

Flesh: sulphur yellow in the cap, brownish in the stem.

Taste: very bitter.

Spores: purplish brown, ellipsoid, with a germ pore, $5-7 \times 3.5-4.5 \mu m$.

Basidia: more or less cylindrical, $20 - 25 \times 5 - 6 \mu m$, four spored.

Pleurocystidia: langeniform, with dark contents, $30 - 45 \times 6 - 9 \mu m$.

Pileipellis: a cutis of externally ornamented hyphae overlaying a thicker cellular subcutis.

Habitat: in large clusters on logs and tree stumps, in a range of forest types where there are wet logs including conifer plantations.

Notes: The orange brown colours of the cap distinguish this species from the closely related *H. fasciculare* which has a sulphur yellow cap but is otherwise similar.
