Inocybe aff splendens

Cap: convex, umbonate; 35 - 60 mm diameter; brownish-orange (5C5); no velar remnants.

Stipe: cylindrical with a sub-bulbous base; $45 - 55 \times 10$ mm; white, glabrous.

Gills: deeply adnexed to almost free; pale brown; in two series.

Flesh: white.

Spores: pale brown; phaeseoliform; $7-9 \times 5$ -6 µm.

Cheilocystidia: numerous; broadly lageniform, with thick walled and sparsely

mucronate apices; $15-20 \times 40-60 \mu m$.

Pileipellis: a cutis.

Habitat: growing in group in rainforest litter near a track, Acacia also present.

Notes: This is rather large for an Inocybe, yet it keys to that genus in both Australian

and European keys to the genera. There is no species close to this listed in Grgurinovic. It is somewhat like the European *I. splendens*, but clearly distinct.
