Cap: applanate with shallow umbo; 60 mm diameter; glabrous; pale orangy brown (5B3); margin acute.

Stipe: cylindrical, tough, slightly eccentric; $35 \times 5 - 6$ mm; pale buff, pale orangy brown; fibrillose.

Gills: subdecurrent; crowded; cream; lammellulae present and \pm half length of gills.

Flesh: thin. tough; whitish buff; not changing on exposure to air.

Chemical reactions:

Spores: broadly ellipsoid; amyloid; $6.4-7.4\times4.8-5.8~\mu m$, average $7\pm0.36\times5\pm0.36~\mu m$; Q=1.2-1.5, average 1.4 ± 0.1 ; ornamented with small amyloid warts.

Basidia: clavate, four spored. **Pleurocystidia:** None seen

Pileipellis: a cutis of repent hyphae.

Habitat: growing singly in a garden containing native plants including *Ficus*, possibly associated with mulch made from native plants.

Notes: the brown fungus is not readily recognised as a *Lepista* until the ornamented spores are seen. The habitat and spore size place this collection close to *Lepista sordida* which has been reported in Queensland. However it shows no violaceous colours in the gills and is likely to be another species.
