## Pluteus nanus

Cap: applanate with a small umbo; 20 - 25 mm diameter; velutinate; dark brown,

chocolate brown; margin somewhat scalloped on older specimens.

**Stipe:** cylindrical;  $20 - 50 \times 3$  mm; glabrous, cream. Gills: free; pink; lamellulae present in a single series.

Flesh: thin, pinkish white.

Taste:

**Spores:** pink; subglobose;  $5.9 - 8 \times 5.5 - 6.7$  µm; average  $6.5 \pm 0.5 \times 6 \pm 0.4$  µm; Q = 1 - 1.2, average  $1.08 \pm 0.07$ ; slightly thick walled.

**Basidia:** 

**Cheilocystidia:** ovoid, hyaline;  $50 - 80 \times 25 - 30 \mu m$ .

Pleurocystidia: absent. Pileipellis: a hymeniderm.

**Habitat:** growing on an old and very rotten stump of a rainforest tree.

**Notes:** this small brown pluteus was keyed in Grgurinovic and appears to fit *P. nanus* reasonably well. The spores are slightly smaller than the averages cited, but they are within the range.
