Cap: planoconvex; up to 30 mm diameter; with dark brown patches at centre,

otherwise squamulose; grey brown with pale margin.

**Stipe:** clavate;  $50 \times 3 - 5$  mm; glabrous; white.

Gills: free; moderately crowded; pink; lamellulae present in one series.

Flesh: thin, white.

Taste:

**Spore print:** pink.

**Spores:** ellipsoid;  $6.8 - 8.8 \times 4.6 - 6 \mu m$ , average  $7.7 \pm 0.5 \times 5.4 \pm 0.45 \mu m$ , Q = 1.17

-1.76, average Q = 1.44 ± 0.17; thin walled.

Basidia: clavate; four spored.

**Pleurocystidia:** numerous; fusoid; metuloid with two hook like prongs at apex; 50 –

 $65 \times 14 - 18 \mu m$ ; thick walled.

**Pileipellis:** a cutis of this walled cylindrical hyphae with brown pigment. Clamps

present.

Substrate: large ancient mossy dead tree stump.

**Habitat:** rainforest with Eucalypts.

**Notes:** this collection has some affinities with Horak's *Pluteus similis*, but the fruit bodies are smaller and the spores significantly larger. It does not appear to accord with known Australian species.
