Tricholoma sp 1

Cap: applanate with a broad umbo; 45 - 90 mms diameter; covered in dark brown fibrils which are denser towards the centre and form squamules near the margin; golden brown to dark brown at the centre, underlying flesh cream to pale yellow.

Stipe: cylindrical with a distinctly bulbous base; $40 - 50 \times 15 - 25$ mm; white with golden brown fibrils.

Gills: sinuate; moderately spaced in 2-3 series, golden yellow.

Flesh: white with very faint yellow tinge, unchanging.

Spore print: white.

Spores: ellipsoid; $5 - 6.9 \times 3.6 - 5.3 \mu m$, average $5.9 \pm 0.45 \times 4.5 \pm 0.4 \mu m$, Q = 1.18 - 1

1.51, average Q = 1.32 ± 0.10 ; smooth, somewhat flattened on one side.

Basidia: narrowly clavate; $40 - 50 \times 5 - 8 \mu m$; four spored.

Pleurocystidia: absent.

Pileipellis: a cutis of repent hyphae, some with natural golden brown colouration.

Habitat: In small groups under *Eucalyptus* in wet sclerophyll forest with a limited understorey.

Notes: close to the Northern Hemisphere *Tricholoma sulphureum*, but with no strong smell and a strongly sub-bulbous base. This appears to be a new species.
