Phylloporus cyanescens

Cap: plano-convex; 70 – 90 mm diameter; dry, velutinate; dark brown, hazel (6F6); margin entire.

Stipe: clavate; $60 - 70 \times 12 - 25$ mm; irregular, glabrous surface; pale at apex gradually becoming darker date-brown towards base.

Gills: decurrent; golden yellow; lamellulae in one series; bruising green then slowly browning; not anastomosing or becoming pore-like.

Flesh: thick and white, cyanescing (blue-green) strongly on exposure to air.

Spore print: honey brown.

Spores: subfusiform; $10 - 12.5 \mu m long$.

Basidia: not recorded.

Pleurocystidia: not recorded. Pileipellis: a trichoderm.

Habitat: in Wallum woodland with *Callitris* and *Melaleuca*.

Notes: a large smooth-capped *Phylloporus* with gills and flesh that green strongly on

bruising.
