## Geastrum triplex

**Exoperidium:** pale buff with a pinkish tinge when young; breaking into 5-7 rays, split into 3 layers with a collar between the endo- and exoperidia; 30-120 mm diameter; to finely velutinate; not trapping debris.

Stipe: absent, endoperidium sessile.

**Endoperidium:** globose; grey buff; up to 40 mm diameter; tomentose. **Peristome:** well defined, fibrillose, conical with a pale area around it.

Flesh: thick.

**Spore print:** brown ochraceous, yellowish brown.

**Spores:** globose;  $3.5 - 4.5 \times 3.5 - 4.5 \mu m$  excluding ornamentation, with blunt warts

to  $\pm~0.6~\mu m.$ 

**Habitat:** growing in litter, mulch and garden debris in a wide range of habitats. **Notes:** this large, fleshy, sessile earthstar is easy to identify in the field due to the presence of a collar.
