## Geastrum velutinum

**Exoperidium:** pale reddish brown, breaking into 5-7 rays, split into 2 layers on drying up; up to 30 mm diameter; covered in velvety hairs; not trapping debris.

Stipe: absent, endoperidium sessile.

**Endoperidium:** globose; brown; up to 50 mm diameter; tomentose.

Peristome: well defined, fibrillose, conical.

Flesh: thin.

**Spore print:** brown ochraceous.

**Spores:** globose;  $5-6\times 5-6$  µm excluding ornamentation, with prominent blunt

spines to  $\pm 1 \mu m$ .

**Habitat:** growing in sandy soil in needle litter under *Callitris columellaris*.

**Notes:** this small, ochraceous, sessile earthstar is difficult to identify in the field. Also known as *Geastrum javanicum* in Queensland.
