Agaricus sp. 10

Cap: plano-convex; 50 - 70 mm diameter; finely squamulose; white with greyish squamules.

Stipe: cylindrical with a sub-bulbous base; $60 - 80 \times 5 - 8$ mm; glabrous; white; ring substantial and near apex.

Gills: free, very crowded; greyish pink at first becoming a dark chocolate brown.

Flesh: thin, whitish.
Smell: strong agaricoid.
Spore print: chocolate.

Spores: ellipsoid; $4.5 - 5.5 \times 3 - 3.5 \mu m$; smooth, no germ pore.

Basidia: not observed.

Pleurocystidia: not observed.

Pileipellis: a cutis of repent hyphae, no clamps.

Substrate: sandy soil amongst litter and possibly mulch.

Notes: the white cap with grey squamules separates this collection from *A. impudicus*.

It may just be a colour variant.

Habitat: wallum.
