Cap: convex; 12 - 20 mm diameter; greasy; dark chestnut brown (8F4), with a thin

yellowish brown margin

Stipe: clavate, hollow, caespitose; $20 - 30 \times 2 - 3$ mm; glabrous to minutely

pubescent; dark chestnut brown, slightly paler than cap.

Gills: adnexed; crowded; greyish pink; with lamellulae in two intercalated series.

Flesh: thin, greyish brown.

Smell: none.

Spore print: cream with a very slight pink tinge. **Spores:** ellipsoid; $10 - 12 \times 6 - 8 \mu m$; smooth. **Basidia:** clavate; $55 - 70 \times 12 - 15 \mu m$; two spored.

Cheilocystidia: clavate to subcapitate; $55 - 90 \times 14 - 30 \mu m$;

Pleurocystidia: not observed.

Pileipellis: an ixocutis with hyphae some 5 μm wide.

Habitat: dry sclerophyll woodland under Angophora, caespitose in frass, litter

enriched by caterpillars grouping at the base of a tree.

Notes: this a close look-alike for the North American Collybia alkavirens but it has a

very different habitat and with significantly larger spores.
