Fruiting body: a cup, 15-20 mm diameter; upper fruiting surface smooth; grey, greyish brown (7D3); margin with prominent shaggy hairs. Lower surface greyish brown, with hairs smaller than those on the margin

Stipe: clavate, narrow at apex, widest at base; $40 - 50 \times 2 - 4$ mm; ochraceous with grey hairs.

Spore print: none.

Asci: clavate with rounded apex containing 8 spores.

Spores: ellipsoid; $14.5 - 17 \times 11.5 - 12.5 \,\mu\text{m}$, Q = 1.3; smooth.

Habitat: growing on a damp bare bank in wet sclerophyll forest dominated by

Eucalypts.

Notes: This is very Helvella like and greyish brown. It does not seem to be frequent in SEO but perhaps it is everylocked.
