## Pluteus sp. 'albidus'

Cap: shallowly convex; 40 - 50 mm diameter; minutely velutinate; white with a grey

buff tint, darker towards centre; striate on outer 1/3 of radius.

**Stipe:** cylindrical, slightly expanded at base, curved;  $40 - 55 \times 3 - 5$  mm; glabrous;

white; striate at point of attachment, insititious.

Gills: free, moderately crowded; pink, pale pink; lamellulae in one series.

Flesh: thin, white.

Smell: raphanoid (radish).

**Spore print:** pink.

**Spores:** broadly ellipsoid;  $5.3-6.8\times3.6-4.8~\mu m$ , average  $5.85\pm0.4\times4.15\pm0.3~\mu m$ , Q=1.19-1.58, average  $Q=1.41\pm0.11$ ; with granular oily contents.

Basidia: not recorded.

**Cheilocystidia:** fusoid with apical hooks;  $60 - 80 \times 12 - 15 \mu m$ ; thick walled. **Pleurocystidia:** conical with apical hooks;  $60 - 80 \times 12 - 15 \mu m$ ; thick walled.

**Pileipellis:** a cutis of repent hyphae  $10 - 15 \mu m$  wide. **Substrate:** on wood of large fallen *Ficus watkinsiana*.

Habitat: rainforest.

**Notes:** this very pale white *Pluteus* could not be found in Horak or Gates or Grgurinovic. Close to *P. lutensis* but with smaller spores and a pale cap. It is characterised by its pale colours, very numerous hooked cystidia. **Collections examined:** PL 0317, Bellthorpe, Morgan Clark, 28 Mar 2017.
