Amanita albosquamosa

Cap: applanate; 50–70 mm diameter; surface smooth with patches of veil; white to cream.

Stipe: cylindrical above a turbinate bulb; $60-70 \times 10$ mm; smooth, white with small powdery remains which brown with age, giving the impression of a ring zone.

Gills: free; crowded; cream but browning on bruising; lamellulae in two series.

Spore print: white.

Spores: ellipsoid; $9-11 \times 7-8 \mu m$, Q = 1.3; amyloid in Melzer's.

Basidia: clavate; $35-45 \times 10-12 \mu m$.

Cheilocystidia: none seen.

Pileipellis: a cutis.

Habitat: growing in a small group in mixed rainforest with Eucalypts.

Notes: This species has a number of look-alikes and can only be separated on the

basis of microscopic characters.
