Cap: plano-convex; 40 - 55 mm diameter; fibrillose; pinkish brown drying to yellow brown.

Stipe: cylindrical with a sub-bulbous base; $40 - 50 \times 5 - 8$ mm; slightly fibrillose; pale becoming yellow brown; ring present but ephemeral.

Gills: free, very crowded; greyish pink at first becoming a dark chocolate brown.

Flesh: thin, whitish.

Smell: strong agaricoid.

Spore print: chocolate.

Spores: ellipsoid; $4.5 - 5.4 \times 3 - 3.5 \mu m$, average $4.9 \pm 0.2 \times 3.2 \pm 0.1 \mu m$, Q = 1.41 - 1.67, average $Q = 1.53 \pm 0.08$; smooth, with offset thingy, no germ pore.

Pileipellis: a cutis of repent hyphae, no clamps.

Substrate: grass verge.

Notes: the brown squamulose cap resembles *A. augustus* but these specimens are smaller, do not possess a large pendulous ring and have much smaller spores.

Habitat: urban street with grass and some planted trees.
