Cap: shallowly convex; 55 mm diameter; glabrous, dry; brownish orange (6C4, 6C5); margin very indistinctly striate and slightly inrolled.

Stipe: cylindrical, slightly enlarged at apex; $50 - 60 \times 10 - 14$ mm; glabrous; white with a slight brownish tinge; ring absent but brown ring zones seen low on stipe; very distinctive dark brown volva.

Gills: adnexed; cream, lamellulae absent.

Flesh: white. Smell: none.

Spore print: white.

Spores: ellipsoid; $8.1 - 9.7 \times 5.7 - 6.7 \mu m$, average $9 \pm 0.5 \times 6.2 \pm 0.35 \mu m$; Q =

1.31 - 1.67, average $Q = 1.45 \pm 0.09$; amyloid.

Basidia: narrowly clavate; $30 - 40 \times 7 - 9 \mu m$; four spored.

Cheilocystidia: clavate to almost capitate; $45 - 55 \times 7 - 9 \mu m$; with opaque contents

and what appears to be a terminal oil drop.

Pleurocystidia: absent.

Pileipellis: an irregular cutis of interwoven brown hyphae.

Substrate: in sandy soil.

Habitat: dry sclerophyl forest under Eucalyptus.

Notes: the collection is not in Woods key, there do not seem to be any Amanitas described with the distinctively brown volva that characterizes this species. **Collections examined:** PL 0417, Elanda Point, Great Sandy National Park, Pat

Leonard, 1 Apr 17.
