Austroboletus sp 'Brown'

Cap: irregularly convex; to 70 mm diameter; foxy red brown (8D6-8, 8E8); viscid to greasy, with small irregular flocks on a white background, margin entire and retracting from pores.

Stipe: cylindrical; $70 - 90 \times 8 - 12$ mm; pale fawn with a deep red brown reticulum.

Flesh: white, soft, spongy; unchanging on exposure to air.

Pores: deeply adnexed to almost free; radially elongated at centre; pale at first becoming dull brown to pinkish purple; mostly pentagonal; 2-3 per mm.

Spores: broadly fusoid with an ornamented central band; $12.1 - 16.1 \times 6.7 - 9.7 \mu m$; average $14.7 \pm 1.05 \times 8.2 \pm 0.6$, Q = 1.38 - 2.4, average $Q = 1.82 \pm 0.2$; thick walled.

Basidia: not observed. Cheilocystidia: not seen.

Pileipellis: trichoderm made up of narrow brown hyphae with few septa.

Habitat: growing in humus on an old log about 30 cm above ground level, in Wallum woodland dominated by *Callitris* and *Allocasuarina*.

Notes: this collection keyed to *Austroboletus* sp. 1, described by Watling from a single collection in Cooloola.
