Cap: convex; 50 - 90 mm diameter; velutinate, somewhat irregular; brownish orange (6C7, 6C8); margin entire.

Stipe: cylindrical; $40 - 50 \times 15 - 18$ mm; glabrous; yellow, staining yellow brown on handling.

Pores: adnexed; yellow becoming olivaceous; rounded, pentagonal; 2 per mm.

Flesh: pale yellow; unchanging on exposure to air

Smell: none.

Spore print: yellow brown, olivaceous.

Spores: fusoid; $9.9 - 12.7 \times 4.1 - 6.2 \mu m$, average $11.2 \pm 1 \times 5 \pm 0.7 \mu m$, Q = 1.92 - 2.8, average $Q = 2.27 \pm 0.34$; not ornamented.

Cheilocystidia: not seen. Pileipellis: an irregular cutis.

Habitat: growing in small groups in soil in wet sclerophyll forest with *Eucalyptus*. **Notes:** this collection matches Watling & Li's species 15 with a fulvous (brownish orange) cap and yellow yellow stipe. The spores also match closely but the flesh is a very pale yellow and the staining reaction of the stipe is not recorded.
