Boletus sp 'Paluma orange'



Cap: convex; 70 - 100 mm; glabrous; tacky but not viscid; deep burnt orange; margin just appendiculate.

Stipe: clavate; $80 - 90 \times 20 - 35$ mm; glabrous, occasionally with shallow vertical ridges; bright orange at apex becoming reddish orange in central section and almost brown at base; mycelium orange.

Pores: adnexed; rounded; 1.5 - 2 per mm; very bright orange.

Flesh: pale orange, slowly turning dark blue then gradually fading to olivaceous;

colour change strongest in pores.

Smell: strong of soft cheese, camembert.

Spore print: orange.

Spores: Basidia:

Pleurocystidia: Pileipellis:

Substrate: in soil.

Habitat: wet sclerophyll forest with *Eucalyptus microcorys* and *Allocasuarina* torulosa

Notes: this large and very bright orange bolete is very distinctive, it does not appear to have been found outside North Oueensland.
