## Cantharellus aff melanoxeros

Cap: more or less applanate; 4 - 8 mm diameter; velutinate; radially folded; pale orange, margin downturned.

**Stipe:** irregular cylindrical,  $25 - 30 \times 2 - 4$  mm; glabrous, much deeper orange than cap; somewhat thickened near base but not bulbous.

Gills: subdecurrent to decurrent, widely spaced, anstomizing; greyish orange.

Flesh: pale orange, blackening on stem and around gills on bruising.

**Taste:** 

**Spore print:** white.

**Spores:** ellipsoid;  $8.5 \times 6 \mu m$ ; unornamented, inamyloid; with granular contents.

**Basidia:** narrowly clavate;  $50 - 90 \times 8 - 10 \mu m$ ; four and five spored, clamps at base?

Pleurocystidia: not seen.

Pileipellis: an irregular cutis of thin walled hyaline hyphae.

Substrate: soil.

**Habitat:** Wallum woodland with *Callitris* and *Eucalyptus* and *Banksia aemilii* **Notes:** this small orange *Cantharellus* with greyish gills, blackens on bruising so is

probably in the same group as C. melanoxeros
