

Collybia sp 3808

Cap: convex to planoconvex; 50 - 60 mm diameter; white with a cinnamon spot at centre; glabrous; edge somewhat sulcate.

Stipe: Cylindrical, some attenuated to base; 40 - 5- × 5 - 10 mms; white browning slightly with age; glabrous; tough, fibrous, hollow.

Gills: sinuate attached by a collarium, widely spaced; in two series; cream to pale buff.

Flesh: thin, pale buff.

Spore print: white.

Spores: white; ellipsoid, 5 - 7 × 3 - 4 μ m, slightly amyloid.

Cheilocystidia: none seen.

Pileipellis: a cutis.

Habitat: growing in groups attached to littler under *Eucalyptus pilularis*.

Notes: the whitish cap, sinuate gills attached to a collarium and lack of cystidia distinguish this species. Not in Grgurinovic.
