


Cyathus colensoi

Cup: Campanulate, (bell shape), 6-7 mm high x 5-6 mm wide, +/- 1mm stipe
External pallid-grey to bay brown, finely tomentose, margin entire, even.
Internal lead coloured, smooth, somewhat shiny,

Peridioles: lenticular, 2mm diam., black with thin tunica, cortex thick, single layer

Spores: variable in size and shape – ellipsoid (10-12 x 8-10µ) and subglobose (9-12µ diam.)

Substrate: dead wood on ground, crowded or caespitose

Habitat: garden, parks, rare

Notes: No specimens are held in BRI
