## Cyathus gracilis

Cup: inverted cone, 8-10 mm tall $\mathrm{X} 4-7 \mathrm{~mm}$ wide, tapering to narrow stipe, spreading basal emplacement.

External - dark rusty brown, covered in conical tufts of hairs 65-70 mu long.
Internal - somewhat paler, with faint plication, extending down 1 mm from margin
Peridioles: 2 mm diam., circular with double cortex
Spores: ellipsoid 17.5-20 X 10-12 mu,
Substrate: wood, twigs,
Habitat: eucalypt forest
Notes: 1 specimen in BRI from J. Cribb; Previously known only from Philippines. The conical tufting of the exterior is very difficult to differentiate in the field, from the appearance of Cyathus stercoreus, after wetting .
