Cup: Funnel shaped, 12-14 mm high x 5-7 mm wide at mouth, tapering gradually to base, with short 2 mm stipe,

External dark brown, with appressed tomentum (matted hairy),

Internal black dull, longitudinally striate for about half depth of cup, margin entire, even

Peridioles: lenticular, 2.3-3 mm diam., black, tunica thin and white

Spores: ellipsoid, somewhat pointed at both ends, 11-13 x 5-6 mu.

Substrate: rotting bark

Habitat: Banks Peninsular, NZ
