## Calyptella longipes

Cap: tubular bell shaped;  $15 \times 1$ -2 mm wide, white to off-white; dry and smooth. Stipe: narrow, 1-3  $\times$  1-2 mm wide; white, dry and smooth, often fused clusters.

Gills: smooth, white inner surface, with no gills present.

**Spore print:** white.

**Spores:** subglobose to ellipsoid;  $9-10.5 \times 9-10 \mu m$ ; smooth.

**Substrate:** wood, often large logs. **Habitat:** wet forests and rainforests.

Frequency: occasional.

**Notes:** these "bells on a stem" are quite distinctive but care should be taken not to confuse it with native white *Favolaschia* species, which may look bell–shaped but have pores rather than a hollow tube.
