## Craterellus australis

Cap: funnel shaped (infundibuliform), 8-45 mm diameter. Surface smooth but uneven, dark grey to almost black. Cap margin wavy.

**Stipe:** distinctly tapering towards the base, hollow,  $30 - 50 \times 3 - 8$  mm, distinctly uneven, pitted, pale grey.

Gills: absent, with vein like folds that may branch, greyish.

Flesh: soft and fibrous with a pleasant smell.

Taste:

**Spores:** ellipsoid, smooth,  $9 - 12 \times 7 - 8 \mu m$ .

**Basidia:** clavate to subclavate, 55 – 90 μm, four spored

Pleurocystidia: absent.

**Pileipellis:** of longitudinal thick walled hyphae,  $5 - 9 \mu m$  wide.

Habitat: growing in groups in sandy soil in Wallum and other sandy heathland

places.

**Notes:** The small greyish black funnel shaped fungi with a grey lower surface, is distinctive. This is a seldom recorded Australian species that is placed in the Genus *Cantharellus* by Corner.
