Dictyopanus pusillus

Pileus: weakly convex, round to kidney-shaped; 2–5 mm diameter; smooth but appears velvety under a lens; cream, pale fawn to buff.

Stem: lateral, reduced; $1-8 \times 0.5-1$ mm; minutely velvety; pale fawn.

Pores: about 3 per mm; usually round but may be radially elongated towards the

stem.

Spore print: white.

Spores: ellipsoid; $4-5.5 \times 2-3$ µm; smooth, hyaline. **Substrate:** wood, including wooden outdoor furniture.

Habitat: forests and woodlands.

Notes: this pored fungus is easily recognised by its small size, shape, attachment and

colour. This species is also known as *Panellus pusillus*.
