Cap: broadly convex to applanate; 50 - 70 mm diameter; glabrous; old rose when young, becoming reddish brown.

Stipe: clavate; $45 - 50 \times 8 - 15$ mm; more or less glabrous with some vertical ridges; white.

Pores: adnexed to almost free; ovoid to pentagonal, radially elongated into chains arranged; pinkish; 1 per mm.

Flesh: white; taste very bitter. **Spore print:** dull pinkish brown.

Spores: fusoid; $10.2 - 14.1 \times 5 - 6.35 \mu m$, average $12.3 \pm 1.1 \times 5.7 \pm 0.4$, $Q = 2 - 1.1 \times 5.7 \pm 0.4$

2.4, average Q = 2.17 ± 0.15 ; smooth, pale brown in KOH.

Basidia: Cystidia:

Habitat: in wet sclerophyll forest under *Eucalyptus* species.

Notes: this collection is quite close in appearance and spore size to *Tylopilus rubrobrunneus* which has been reported from North Queensland, but it is unlikely for it to have been introduced.
