There have been forays in 2014, 2015 and this time, Cyclone Debbie had dumped days of rain. Many fungi appeared, many previously unrecorded. It is a working grazing property - open woodland, rainforest and open grass pastures.

Fran Guard Purple polypores - hunting down some IDs.

The first, *Trichaptum byssogenum* (Jungh.) Ryvarden was found at Blackdown Tableland, near Emerald 20 May 2017

700 m ASL and more moisture than on the lowlands, as it had rained recently. It is a polypore with purple edges, on a burned log.

Underneath - purple maze-like structure, the top was brown. Fran examined the spores under a microscope. A feature was the gorgeous cystidia covered in crystals along length of the tubes.

The second purple polypore *Trichaptum biforme* (Fries) Ryvarden came from North Qld, on a property near Topaz. It is known worldwide, and can appear in 100s on a dead trunk.

Fran will describe these in detail in an article in The Qld Mycologist.
